Fruit Bearing Trees & Shrubs / Vegetable Gardens / Mulch Beds

Fruit Bearing Trees & Shrubs are not permitted

Vegetable Gardens

- Vegetable Gardens must be laid out on a copy of a plot plan and submitted for approval specifying location and size
- Vegetable Gardens cannot be larger than 8x10
- Vegetable Gardens must be fenced in to keep animals out
- All attached units must sign off on the request prior to submission
- Vegetable Garden approvals are valid for 1 year, gardens must be resubmitted each year for approval
- Vegetable Garden must be maintained for weed control throughout the growing season
- Once harvested the fence must be removed and all brush cut to ground level
- Fence must be removed no later than November 15th and all brush removed
- If we receive any neighbor complaints regarding unwanted animals the garden must be removed within 7 days
- Any changes to an existing garden must be reviewed and approved by the Board
- A \$25 fine will be assessed for the following offenses
 - o Garden becomes overgrown the owner will have 7 days to clean it up. Failure to clean it up within 7 days the fine will assessed and the unit owner may be asked to remove the garden, return it to its original state, and will not be permitted to install a garden in the future
 - o Garden fence is not removed by 11/15 and all brush removed
 - o Failure to remove garden by the date requested

Mulch Beds

- Mulch Beds must be laid out on a copy of a plot plan and submitted for approval
- Mulch Beds are considered to contain only flowers and non-fruit bearing shrubs
- Mulch Beds may be restricted in size based on requested lot size, location and size of bed
- Mulch Beds must be maintained for weed control throughout the growing season
- Owner is responsible to replace any dead or overgrown flowers or shrubs
- Any changes to the size of an existing mulch bed must be reviewed and approved by the Board

AMENDMENTS TO RULES AND REGULATIONS (8/27/18)

IX. GENERAL ENFORCEMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 4. Bird Feeders (seed and nectar) and/or Bird Houses are permitted so that unit owners may enjoy wild bird watching, subject to the following restrictions:
 - a) Locations of feeder/bird houses must be laid out on a copy of a plot plan and submitted for approval including location and size
 - b) Bird feeder and/or bird house cannot be attached to the unit;
 - c) A seed bird feeder and/or bird house must have a tray to keep seeds from falling to the ground and rooting or drawing in rodents;

- d) Seed and nectar bird feeders must be positioned in a location which does not cause birds to fly over adjacent unit owner's property causing an interference of their use and enjoyment of their property;
- e) Unit owner must clean the bird feeder and/or bird house and area around the bird feeder and/or bird house on a regular basis;
- f) Unit owner may be asked to remove the bird feeder and/or bird house if there is spilled seed, an accumulation of bird feces, and if the feeder and/or house is damaged, moldy, dirty, or unsightly in appearance; and
- g) Unit owner may be asked to remove the bird feeder and/or house if there is an indirect nuisance of an odor emanating from the feeder, an overgrowth of plants and weeds from spilled bird seed which can easily spread to neighboring lawns ruining or killing expensive landscaping, if there is evidence of attraction of rodents, deer or bears, or if there are complaints from neighbors.
- h) A maximum allowed combined total of three (3) bird feeders and/or bird houses with one portal each.
- i) All requests must be submitted with proposed location of the bird feeders and/or bird houses with pictures of the proposed bird house and/or bird feeders
